Big Ideas	<p>This topic is a local geography study that looks at potential areas of re-development in Lowestoft. The challenge is to come up with an idea for the re-generation of the town. Local businessman Peter Colby will be involved, and will be the head judge in The Dragon’s Den where the ideas will be assessed. This topic is all about looking to the future – the future of Lowestoft, and of the children themselves.</p>		<p>As geographer we will learn a range of important skills, such as reading 6 figure grid references, creating a map to scale, reading OS maps and interpreting a key, the points of the compass and using scales. The children will also learn practical fieldwork skills such as how to conduct a quality of life or traffic survey. Fieldwork will be conducted in and around the town of Lowestoft, and will inform the children’s entries for The Dragon’s Den.</p>	
	<p>As writers we will write scripts for The Dragon’s Den. We will also make notes during Mr Colby’s talk, and record information in a range of ways during our fieldwork in Lowestoft. We will also write questionnaires, reports and conclusions of our findings.</p>		<p>In PE the children will continue to develop their athletic, swimming and striking and fielding game skills.</p>	
	<p>As readers we will read about Lowestoft from a range of sources, including The Lowestoft Journal and Wikipedia. We will use online sources to gain a picture of the town in the past and present. We will read a range of materials from Lowestoft’s tourist information centre.</p>		<p>In SRE the children will learn about human reproduction: fertilisation, pregnancy and foetal development and birth. As scientists, the children will also consider genetic inheritance in animals and humans.</p>
